

IMTA State Conference Presenters & Performers



Sean Chen

A "thoughtful musician well beyond his years" (The Republic), pianist Sean Chen shares his "alluring, colorfully shaded renditions" (New York Times) and "genuinely sensitive" (LA Times) playing with audiences around the world. Winner of the 2013 American Pianists Awards, the 2013 Van Cliburn Piano Competition Bronze medal,

and named a 2015 Annenberg Fellow, Mr. Chen is the Jack Strandberg/Missouri Endowed Chair Associate Professor of Piano at the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory.

Sean Chen has performed with the orchestras of Milwaukee, Fort Worth, Indianapolis, Phoenix, Kansas City, and San Diego among many others, and collaborated with such esteemed conductors as Leonard Slatkin, Michael Stern, Gerard Schwarz, and Nicholas McGegan. A multifaceted musician, he also transcribes, composes, and improvises.

Solo recital engagements have taken him to Boston's Jordan Hall, Chicago's Dame Myra Hess Series, New York City's SubCulture, The Smithsonian in Washington, Amsterdam's Concertgebouw and dozens of other venues throughout the world.

Mr. Chen resides in the suburbs of Kansas City with his wife, Betty, a violinist in the Kansas City Symphony, and their two daughters. When not at the piano, he enjoys tinkering with computers and exploring math, science, and programming.



Catherine Rollin

Catherine Rollin, NCTM, is a pianist, composer, clinician, masterclass presenter, author and dedicated teacher. She has over 450 published works with Alfred and has presented workshops throughout the U.S., Canada, Japan and Taiwan. Her technique series, *Pathways to Artistry* was

ground breaking in its synthesis of relaxed physicality with musicality. Catherine's ASCAP award winning series "Museum Masterpieces" has inspired and ignited the imaginations of teachers and students worldwide. As of 2023, Catherine launched Catherine Rollin Music with Museum Masterpieces: the Premier Exhibition, followed by Museum Masterpieces: Celebrating Women Artists Through The Ages Books 1 and 2 in 2024. Catherine is honored to have all three of these books represented in the new National Federation of Music Clubs Festival Bulletin for 2024-2028.

Brian Shepard

Brian Shepard is Chief Executive Officer of Music Teachers National Association. Shepard first began his career at MTNA in 2003 as the Director of Marketing and Public Relations. In 2008, as a result of his successes in marketing the programs and services of MTNA, he was promoted to Chief Operating Officer.

In addition to his work at MTNA, Shepard serves on several other nonprofit boards and committees, including the National Music Council. From 2009 to the present, Brian has served in multiple leadership roles with the American Classical Music Hall of Fame, including Board Chair and Professional Organizations Advisory Council Chair. He currently serves the Hall of Fame as Board President. Since 2013, he has been a member of the CCMpower Board, having held the positions of Treasurer, Harmony Fund Co-Chair, Awards Committee Co-Chair, Board Development Committee Co-Chair and Membership Committee Co-Chair. Shepard has also served on the Cincinnati Opera Sales and Marketing Committee and was President of the Middletown Music Club for three years.

Shepard is also an accomplished musician who performs frequently for church and community programs as a pianist, vocal soloist and choral conductor.

A graduate of Miami University of Ohio, Shepard holds degrees in marketing and music education. He was named an MTNA Foundation Fellow in 2010.



Dr. Eugenio Alfaro III

Dr. Eugenio Alfaro III is a dedicated violinist and educator with a career focus in performance and string education. Dr. Alfaro currently serves as Adjunct Violin Instructor at St. Ambrose University and a Violin Instructor with the Quad City Symphony Orchestra. He has performed with the Kingsville Symphony Orchestra, Victoria Symphony Orchestra,

Corpus Christi Symphony Orchestra, Valley Symphony Orchestra, Amarillo Symphony, Symphony of Northwest Arkansas, and the Quad City Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Alfaro has also performed in the Interharmony Music Festival in Italy and the Lake City String Academy in Colorado. As an educator he has served as violin instructor for the Texas State Strings Camp in San Marcos, TX and string orchestra conductor for the Coastal Bend String Camp in Corpus Christi, TX. In addition, Dr. Alfaro has served as a high school orchestra director and violin instructor in the Houston area. His current research, Music Performance and ADHD: A Qualitative Study on the Experiences of Graduate Music Performance Students With ADHD, examines potential solutions for graduate music performance students with ADHD that can be applicable to all music students.



Stephen Mulvahill

Pianist and educator Stephen Mulvahill, a native of Houston, is an active performing artist and experienced teacher at both the collegiate and pre-college levels. Stephen is Adjunct Professor of Piano and Music History at St. Ambrose University and Adjunct Professor of Music Theory, Aural Skills, and Piano at Kirkwood Community College. He is an ABD

doctoral candidate in Piano Performance and Pedagogy at the University of Iowa, where his primary mentor is Dr. Rène Lecuona. Stephen is certified in the Suzuki method and teaches piano at Centrally Rooted in Dubuque. Before that, he taught piano and conducted orchestras for six years at the Preucil School of Music in Iowa City. In his teaching, Stephen uses a strengths-based and supportive approach to help students develop a beautiful piano tone, a sensitive ear, and a fluid and effortless piano technique.

As a pianist, Stephen has won top prizes in the Rosen-Schaffel Concerto Competition and University of Iowa Concerto Competition and has performed at music festivals around the United States and in Europe. He completed a secondary area of study in orchestral conducting at UI and has been invited to give master classes and judge competitions at the college and pre-college level. Stephen's doctoral research centers on building social equity in piano pedagogy.

Stephen holds a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts and a Bachelor of Music degree in Applied Piano from the University of Houston. He is married to clarinetist and educator Ana Maria Locke and has a five-year-old daughter, Anastasia Sophia. When he's not teaching, practicing, or teaching some more, Stephen enjoys being out in nature, cappuccinos, reading, and playing pretend with his daughter.

Dr. Marian Lee

Marian Lee is the Chair of the Music department at St. Ambrose University and a renowned pianist who has performed internationally in prestigious venues such as Carnegie's Weill Hall, Alice Tully Hall in Lincoln Center, Moscow's Tchaikovsky Hall and St. Petersburg's Winter Palace. She has performed in over fifteen countries, from Chile to Norway,

Thailand to Russia, and with numerous orchestras both abroad and nationally, from the Azerbaijan Philharmonic Orchestra to the Quad City Symphony Orchestra. Lee has received numerous US Embassy grants for performances abroad and is a former Fulbright and IREX scholar.

Dr. Lee regularly collaborates with renowned musicians and teaches masterclasses worldwide, from Hong Kong to all over the United States. Marian's popular piano tutorial on YouTube, "The Five Basic Motions of Piano Technique," has garnered over 618,000 views. This Spring, she will be performing at the 2025 World Piano Conference in Serbia.

Lee's training includes a BM and MM at The Juilliard School under György Sandor and Seymour Lipkin, followed by a Fulbright grant to study at the Moscow Conservatory with Naum Shtarkman. She completed her DMA at Johns Hopkins Peabody Conservatory with Boris Slutsky.

Dr. Lee founded St. Ambrose University's Summer Piano Camp in 2017 and has been an active member of MTNA, IMTA, QCMTA & FMTA music organizations. She has taught at various institutions, including the University of Delaware and was a sabbatical replacement for Ksenia Nosikova at the University of Iowa.



Dr. Du Huang

Dr. Du Huang currently serves as Professor of Piano at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, where he has been on the faculty since 2001. Huang has presented solo performances at the Grosser Saal of the Konzerthaus and the Brahms-Saal of the Musikverein in Vienna, Salle Gaveau and Salle Cortot in Paris, Shanghai Music Hall, Beijing Music Hall, and numerous

concert venues in Czech Republic. Huang also performs actively as a member of Unison Piano Duo with pianist Xiao Hu. They have presented piano duo recitals at Carnegie Hall Weill Recital Hall and Merkin Concert Hall in New York City, and performed abroad in Brazil, China, Czech Repblic, Japan, Maylasia, and the Philippines. Their performances were featured on National Public Radio's Performance Today, Iowa Public Television, Iowa Public Radio, and Minnesota Public Radio. The duo has commissioned and premiered numerous new works for the piano duo medium. Unison Piano Duo has issued recordings on Innova, MSR Classics labels in the United States, and the Yangtze River label in China.

Huang received early training at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music's elementary and middle schools from the age

of eight to eighteen. He later graduated from the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music with the Bachelor of Music (magna cum laude) and Master of Music degrees, studying with Professor Eugene Pridonoff. He studied with Professor Gilbert Kalish at the State University of New York at Stony Brook, receiving the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in 2001. He has also studied in master classes with pianist Leon Fleisher. His chamber music coaches include Timothy Eddy, Henry Meyer, and Peter Oundjian.

Huang presented piano master classes at over thirty universities in the United States and many places abroad, including Shanghai International Piano Institute and Festival, Wuhan Conservatory of Music, Middle School affiliated with the Shanghai Conservatory of Music, University of Manila, and European Piano Teacher Conference in Czech Republic. He has served as an adjudicator for Hong Kong Schools Music Festival, Chicago International Duo Piano Competition, and numerous Music Teacher National Association competitions in the states of Iowa, Minneosta, and Wisconsin. Huang frequently serves as a piano faculty member at summer music programs such as Interlochen Arts Camp in Michigan and Saarburg International Music Festival in Germany.



Dr. Luke Tyler

Dr. Luke Tyler has over 20 years of teaching piano to students of all ages and levels, ranging from pre-school aged beginners to college music majors and older adults.

Luke taught at Loras College for 7 years, where he coordinated the keyboard area, taught music theory, and developed courses in

American and world music.

Luke serves as director of Northeast Iowa School of Music (NISOM), in Dubuque, Iowa where he teaches 20+ students while managing all executive responsibilities of the nonprofit. He maintains a professional creative life by regularly performing throughout the midwest as a classical/ jazz pianist. He has notable performances in Tucson, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Fort Wayne, Germany, Beijing, Chicago, Washington DC, and Hong Kong.

Luke is also an avid church musician with over 14 years of professional experience. He currently serves as Music Director at Westminster Presbyterian Church and Contemporary Music Director at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

When not at NISOM, Luke enjoys gardening and spending time with his wife, Lizz, and his two girls.
